Day 1 Step 1 (7 minutes)	Introduction: Who am I?/Who are you? What are we going to do? Body/Voice/Imagination (Song?)		Intoducing them to creative drama through song and sign language, to connect ideas to movement and song.	
Step 2 (7 min)	Be Broccoli – Individual Imagery	Students create shapes with their bodies that represent different fruits, vegetables, animals, and items they are familiar with. Step 3 (7 min)	Mingle Maker – Group Imagery	Working in randomized groups students will work together to create ONE picture that is asked of them.	Planting the seed of the idea that we all need each other at times to create a fuller, and more beautiful picture.	
Step 4 (5 min)	Complete The Picture – Aloha in Pictures	Students will randomly pick a "still scene" from a hat and then work together (and with the help of the teacher/s) to create that picture and identify which parts they play.	Identification of how the parts they play and how they work together to create one picture.	
Step 5 (5 min)	What is Aloha? Did we show Aloha today?	Reflection question, introducing the concept of Aloha/Kindness.	Connecting concepts to activities we did today.	

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Day 2 Step 1 (7 minutes)	Introduction: Question of the Day: What is Aloha to you today?			
Step 2 (7 min)	Random Shapes! Individual/Group Activity	The teacher will shout out different shapes the students must make with different parts of their body, eventually moving to group shapes.	Engaging body/voice/imagination and adding in the layer of working together at the end.	
Step 3	Creating our own "Giving Tree"	Using bodies and teamwork	Engaging with the work	

(5 min)		students will create their own versions of who the "Giving Tree" is throughout the story (guided help)	using their body, as well as with each other to create one image.	
Step 4	How did the tree give Aloha? How did we create Aloha today?	Refocus and Reflect	To reinforce the themes of the day by recalling how we showed "aloha" to one another.	

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Day 3 Step 1 (7 minutes)	Introduction:			
Step 2 (3 min)	Be The Tree/Aloha Shake	Students will use their bodies to create fantastical and whimsical "tree" shapes; giving our bodies some relief in between by giving ourselves an "aloha shake" in between each pose.	To engage bodies and imaginations and remind students of the themes of the "Giving Tree" through body memory.	
Step 3 (10 min)	How WE tell "Giving Tree"	Students will create tableaus and sounds that represent their version of the "Giving Tree."	Giving students autonomy over the story and re-tell the "The Giving Tree."	
Step 4 (10 min)	Aloha Apples	Students will be given pictures of apples, asked to color them in, and think of three words or images of how THEY will show aloha.	A fun craft to engage artistic whims and be creative in a different medium; encouraging students to draw their aloha they want to give.	Cut-out apples Markers/Colored pencils/crayons Craft Supplies

Step 5 (3 min)	Who am I going to give my apple to? How can I continue to give Aloha?	Refocus and remind.	Connecting all the dots to remind the students that their aloha is for anyone!	
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
